Essential Services - Water and Sanitation

- Despite security threats, local governments are continuing to improve service delivery to constituents
 - Baghdad City Council continued installation of new sewage pumping stations in the 9 Nissan district and a new drainage pipeline in Karada district
- Despite the security situation in April, the Iraq engineering subcontractor has continued work at the Al Hillah wastewater treatment plant
 - Project is still on track for completion in August 2004
- A new water supply system project in Baghdad's Sadr City will increase the quantity and quality of potable water for citizens in the neighborhood
 - The site has been identified and project design work is underway

CPA Water Objective: Provide Water Supply, Sewerage & Municipal Services; Improve Water Resource Management

Essential Services – Telecommunications

- Total number of telephone subscribers is now over 1,105,000 (inc. 344,000 cell phone subscribers) – nearly 33 % above pre-war levels
- Implementation of the Interim First Responder Network, which is approximately 70% installed, is scheduled to be completed by Aug 04
- Rehabilitation of the national fiber optic network is on schedule for completion by July
 - The Iraqi Telephone and Postal Commission (ITPC) is completing facilities work at 24 sites between Baghdad and Basrah in preparation for installation of broadband digital signal transmission equipment
 - Connectivity between Iraqi cities will deliver the voice and data communications Iraq needs both for its immediate requirements and for future economic development

Essential Services – Transportation



- Average number of civilian aircraft departures per day for week of 19 - 25 Apr : Baghdad International Airport: 43; Basrah: 2; Mosul: 23
- Ministry of Transportation staff attended meeting hosted by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and the International Air Transport Association (IATA) in Kuwait to discuss Iraqi airspace
- As of 25 Apr, Maersk has agreed to remain port manager at Khawr Az Zubayr, pending completion of a negotiated bridge contract until 30 Jun
 - MoT intends to award a long term port operations/management contract pursuant to a full and open competition by 30 Jun
- The reconstruction of the rail line from Port of Umm Qasr to Shuiaba junction continues despite security challenges
 - Work will improve freight transport from the port to the rest of Iraq



Essential Services – Food Security (cont)

- **The increase in insurgent actions may result in localized shortages where communities are isolated from the normal distribution system**
 - **As at 23 Apr, Fallujah had sufficient food supplies**
 - **The Ministry of Trade is developing contingency strategies to feed non-combatants in Fallujah and other towns and**
- **CPA projects a deficit of rice in the food basket at the beginning of May due to delays in unloading ships at Umm Qasr port**
 - **Working with the Ministries of Transportation and Trade to address delays**
 - **Ministry officials believe Iraqis will supplement rice needs from local markets in the short term, and be satisfied with “arrears distributions” starting in May**
- **The Ministry of Trade is seeking to accelerate the delivery of a tea shipment from Vietnam to cover May ration needs**
 - **May rations already reduced from 200 grams per person to 150 grams**

Essential Services - Health Care

- **Ministry of Health (MoH) coordinated additional ambulance convoys and medical supplies to Fallujah and, as at 26 Apr, the medical situation was stable**
 - **MoH is remaining postured to affect medical responses in the event combat action intensifies or there is a need to evacuate additional non-combatants from the area**
- **Efforts to mitigate pharmaceutical shortages across Iraq continue and three emergency purchases of supplies are progressing**
 - **MoH expects critical medicines from first purchase to begin arriving by end of Apr**

CPA Health Objective: Improve Quality and Access to Health Care

- **Develop health care organizations, management, and infrastructure**
- **Train health care professionals**
- **Pharmaceuticals logistic support**
- **Secure system**
- **Public health**

Essential Services - Education

- Efforts are underway to expedite the review of appeals from teachers dismissed under De-Ba'athification process and implement decisions made by local appeals committees
 - This will allow thousands of teachers to return to work and thousands more to begin receiving pensions this week
 - Appeals not yet heard will be adjudicated within the next few weeks
- The CPA-funded Baghdad School Improvement Program is nearing completion
 - 1,564 out of approximately 1,700 schools have benefited from \$750 grants for repairs and supplies of their choice
- The Ministry of Education (MoE) has launched the Education Management Information System (EMIS) to better manage services for 4.5 million Iraqi school children

CPA Education Objective: Improve Quality and Access to Education

- Reorganize and staff the Ministry of Education;
- Rehabilitate school buildings and build new schools
- Advance national dialog on curriculum reform
- Continue and expand teacher training

Essential Services - Higher Education

- The review of the appeals of hundreds of university professors dismissed under the De-Ba'athification process will be expedited
 - Those who did not use their posts to intimidate others or commit crimes should be allowed to return to work promptly
- Three Iraqi university professors have been awarded grants to participate in the Fulbright American Studies Institutes
 - Seminars to take place at US universities from mid Jun to early Aug
- Five Iraqi Universities and four US institutions have partnered to strengthen administrative and research capabilities of higher education institutes in Iraq
- The First Armored Division funded a project to provide internet service at eight sites at the Bab Muadham campus of Baghdad University
 - Installation will be completed in early May





Economy

- **The Consumer Price Index was up 9.2 percent (on a monthly basis, not seasonally adjusted) in Mar after falling 5.3 percent in Feb**
 - Increase in Mar largely due to a reported 33.3 percent rise in rent
- **On 25 Apr, estimated crude oil export revenue was \$5.1 billion for 2004**
- **As of 23 Apr, Development Fund for Iraq balance was \$10.3 billion (of this, \$4.3 billion is already committed and \$6.0 billion is slated for projected 2004 budget items)**
- **The Trade Bank of Iraq has issued 198 letters of credit, totaling \$756 million, covering imports from 32 countries**
- **The New Iraqi Dinar was at 1,455 dinars per dollar on 15 Apr, down 0.7 percent from a week ago**
- **Employment figures not provided for past week as security problems have made confirmation of data difficult**

Economy (cont.)

- **The Iraqi Central Bank Governor and Finance Minister attended the spring meeting of the IMF in Washington DC last week**
 - **Trip also included meeting with IMF to discuss the renegotiation of Iraq's external debt and IMF's letter of intent**
- **On 18 Apr, the Governing Council's Finance Committee approved a proposal for restructuring the state-owned banks of Iraq:**
 - **The four small specialized banks will be consolidated into the two large commercial banks (Rafidain and Rasheed)**
 - **The large banks will be rehabilitated and prepared for ownership transfer**
- **The Industrial Union Investment Bank, a private bank wholly-owned by resident Iraqis, opened for business on 19 Apr**
- **Following approval of the Interim Securities Law on 19 Apr, Ambassador Bremer signed the Bankruptcy Order on 20 Apr**
 - **The Order will modernize, strengthen, and clarify Iraqi bankruptcy law**
- **The wage withholding tax was due to be implemented on 01 May**
 - **Will be an important source of non-petroleum revenue for the Iraqi government**

Security - Build Justice



- **Judicial Review Committee has preliminarily vetted all 860 judges and prosecutors from former regime**
 - 178 judges and prosecutors removed through the process
- **The Central Criminal Court of Iraq (CCCI) has completed 87 investigations of 134 cases referred to it since it was created in Jul 03**
 - Completed 12 investigations last week but no trials as no prisoners were transferred during period of unrest
- **New criminal defendants' rights include the right to defense counsel at all stages of criminal proceedings**
 - A training program for judges covering how to implement these rights, establish qualifications for court-appointed defense counsel, establish an impartial appointment system, and related issues is due to begin
- **Individuals detained by Coalition Forces are now being posted daily by name on the internet to address concerns about individual detainees**

Security - Developments

- **CPA and Ministry officials are refocusing efforts to improve training and equipping of Iraqi security forces, and develop better leadership**
 - **This follows the inconsistent performance in the first weeks of Apr**
- **Since early April, New Iraqi Army and Iraqi Police Service (IPS) personnel assigned to duty declined by 1,000 and 2,900, respectively**
 - **Some were sent for retraining, some were killed in the line of duty, and others were removed for actions supporting the insurgency**
- **Four battalions of the Iraqi Army are reconstituting following recent engagements, and preparing to take on additional missions**
- **The Iraqi National Security Council is working with the Ministry to evaluate police in Fallujah, Karbala, and other strained areas**

Security – Developments (Cont.)



- **The Iraqi Coastal Defense Force launched its first patrol boat on 18 Apr**
 - **Training and deployment had been delayed by lack of communication, information technology, and office equipment**
- **IPS and CPA advisors have prepared guidance for security cooperation with Coalition Forces after the transition of authority on 30 Jun**
 - **Guidance emphasizes standard operating procedures between IPS and military units at the tactical and operational levels**




Strategic Communication

- **The first wave of Public Service Announcements supporting the Transitional Administrative Law (TAL), elections and the transition to sovereignty aired this week on Arabic satellite TV networks**
- **The Ninawa' Governorate Television Station broadcast a CPA-sponsored five-minute spot on democracy prepared by local writers, producers and actors**
 - **Other such mini-programs under preparation for future broadcasts and each will be broadcast four times.**
- **Extensive activities continue in support of political transition and the Transitional Administrative Law (TAL), including:**
 - **Distribution of booklets and leaflets on the TAL**
 - **Numerous focus groups, seminars, public forums, and town hall meetings across Iraq**

Goal 01 Jun 04: 6,000 MW Peak Deliverable Generation Capacity



- (U) CPA spring maintenance program continues resulting in about 1,384 MW of generation capacity currently offline for scheduled and 459 MW for unscheduled maintenance




Power Production





Crude Oil Production












