- Estimated crude oil export revenue is over \$5.7 billion for 2004
- Estimated that nearly 425,000 jobs have been created for Iraqis
- New program announced to clear up to 20,000km of waterways to improve water flow and irrigation (will employ around 100,000 Iraqis)



Governance

- **UN Special Representative Lakhdar Brahimi has returned to Iraq and is consulting with a broad spectrum of the Iraqi people and the Iraqi Governing Council (IGC) on the political transition**
- **Nomination process for commissioners of the Independent Election Commission (IEC) concluded on 16 May**
 - **Nominations will be vetted by the UN and candidates will be selected for interview**
- **Inspectors General (IGs) have been appointed for all 26 Ministries and are holding weekly meetings**
 - **The IGs have already recommended cases for criminal prosecution, reflecting the impact the IG system is having on corrupt practices**
- **Four Ministries transferred to full Iraqi control last week, including:**
 - **Industry and Minerals, Water Resources, Foreign Affairs, and Planning and Development**

Strategic Communication

- CPA provided a grant to the Kurdistan Women's Union (KWU) to conduct mobile outreach activities in rural communities of the Arbil Governorate
 - Project targets isolated, vulnerable societies that suffered a great deal of poverty, ignorance, and abuse under the former regime
- Since Jan 04, USAID's Democracy Development Activities (DDA) program has organized over 7,000 sessions in Iraq
 - has stimulated civic participation and increased Iraqis' understanding of the Transitional Administrative Law (TAL) and basic democratic principles
 - led by more than 500 Iraqi facilitators
- Other activities continue in support of political transition and the Transitional Administrative Law (TAL) including:
 - Distribution of booklets and leaflets on the TAL
 - Numerous focus groups, seminars, public forums, and town hall meetings across Iraq

Essential Services - Water and Sanitation

- Completed rehabilitation of three additional water treatment plants in Qadisiyah Governorate and one ground storage tank in Karbala in April
 - Benefits more than 200,000 people
- Planning for rehabilitation of water treatment plants in Al Hillah and Anbar and Diyala' Governorates is underway
 - Rehabilitation of these plants will benefit more than 1 million people
- Ambassador Bremer announced an aggressive program to clear up to 20,000km of waterways to improve water flow and irrigation
 - Program will employ approximately 100,000 of Iraq's unskilled workers
 - Last year's program cleared over 17,000 kilometers of irrigation canals
 - Some 30-40 percent of the marshlands drained by Saddam have been re-flooded since liberation



Create viable organization to deliver water/sewerage/municipal services (WSMS); Expand WSMS to meet national needs; Develop full range of municipal services & inclusive delivery mechanism; Infrastructure improvements to water resource system; Facilities improvements & capacity building within Ministry

Essential Services – Telecommunications

- Total number of telephone subscribers in Iraq is now over 1,155,000 (inc. 389,000 cell phone subscribers) – 38.7 % above pre-war levels

- Chart shows trend in number of telephone subscribers



- The State Owned Internet Company has over 43,000 subscribers in Baghdad and 11,000-12,000 new subscribers are added each week
 - Very limited service existed pre-war


CPA Objectives: Reconstruct Communications & Postal Systems

Build Iraq's first responder network • Establish independent regulatory agency • Upgrade Iraqi Telephone and Postal Company (ITPC) network • Build transmission component data network for Iraq, inc. international gateways • Restructure ITPC and its business operations • Upgrade and modernize postal systems • Upgrade ITPC outside plant for increased subscriber capacity and use

Essential Services - Transportation

- USAID announced the re-opening of the four-lane Khazir Bridge over the Greater Zab River between Mosul and Arbil
 - Bridge is critical for movement of fuel and agricultural products in northern Iraq
- The Korean International Cooperation Agency is donating 23 inter-city buses, 50 intra-city buses, and appropriate spare parts
 - Second shipment arrived on 10 May, final shipment is enroute

- Chart shows number of civilian aircraft departures from Iraqi airports



Essential Services - Food Security

- Chart below shows % of estimated requirements for Public Distribution System (PDS) goods from Apr- 01Jul
- Requirement includes stocks sufficient for the period and a three month buffer for 01 Jul
- While substantial additional shipments of most goods have been procured, they are not shown as these shipments will arrive after 01 Jul



CPA Food Security Objective: Provide Food Security for all Iraqis

Enhance capacity of Ministry of Agriculture • Assure supply of inputs • Strengthen research system • Ensure adequate stocks for Public Distribution System (PDS) • Monitor food security • Hand over administration of system in the North • Initiate reform of rations basket • Environmental Initiatives



Essential Services - Food Security (cont)

- **Ministry of Trade (MOT) recently concluded the procurement of 200,000 metric tons of wheat under their first procurement cycle**
 - **CPA continues to work closely with the MOT on building capacity ahead of the handover**
- **Delivery of large quantities of rice in the coming month will address the temporary shortage previously reported and build buffer stocks**

Essential Services - Health Care

- **Emergency medical supplies were delivered to Fallujah, Ramadi, An Najaf, Karbala', and Baghdad's Sadr City to ensure the health of citizens in conflicted areas**
- **Over 5 million children have been immunized for Measles, Mumps, and Rubella through the work of the Ministry of Health, UNICEF and WHO**
- **Completed rehabilitation of Al Qadisiyah Hospital in Baghdad's Sadr City, which had been poorly maintained and had few supplies**
 - **The fourth health facility in Sadr City improved by local community members in collaboration with USAID**
- **Ministry of Health (MoH) 24 hour Operations Center continues to respond to the fluctuating situation in the country**
 - **Also preparing to address medical issues arising from displaced persons**
- **A program was launched to equip birthing centers and train attendants to serve 440,000 people in the rural areas of Diyala', Anbar, Babil and Najaf Governorates**

CPA Health Objective: Improve Quality and Access to Health Care

Develop health care organizations, management, & infrastructure; Train health care professionals; Pharmaceuticals logistic support; Secure system; Public health

Essential Services - Education

- Efforts are underway to expedite the review of appeals from teachers dismissed under de-Ba'athification process and implement decisions made by local appeals committees
 - This will allow thousands of teachers to return to work and thousands more to receive pensions
 - Appeals not yet heard will be adjudicated within the next few weeks
- The Accelerated Learning Program conducted year-end examinations last week for 600 students and results should be available 30 May
 - Program seeks to reintegrate Iraqi children into the main schools system who were obliged to quit school prior to 2003
 - The program was piloted with 600 students in five cities and will be expanded to 50,000 in 2004 with support from UNICEF



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

Economy

- On 14 May, estimated crude oil export revenue was over \$5.7B for 2004
 - Exports dropped significantly last week due to sabotage
- As of 06 May, the balance in the Development Fund for Iraq (DFI) was \$10.2B (\$4.8B is already committed, and \$5.5B is slated for projected 2004 budget items)
- The Trade Bank of Iraq has issued 202 letters of credit, totaling \$778.7M, covering imports from 32 countries
- The New Iraqi Dinar was at 1,460 dinars per dollar on 06 May, and has been relatively stable for nearly three months
- Micro-credit loans now total almost \$5 million, with 2,500 clients
 - Provides credit to financially viable micro and small businesses to stimulate private sector growth and create employment
- Employment figures not provided for past two weeks as security problems have made confirmation of data difficult
- Combined Joint Task Force 7 (CJTF-7) estimate that the CPA has created nearly 425,000 jobs for Iraqis (including over 24,000 from PMO contracts)


Economy (cont')

- **The five percent reconstruction levy initiated April 15 collected \$2.7 million in its first 15 days of implementation**
 - **Applies to goods entering the country other than those specifically for relief and reconstruction**
- **CPA and USAID assisting Ministry of Finance's Tax Commission with implementation and public education for the new wage withholding tax**
- **Creation of the new Iraq Stock Exchange is progressing with training for employees of the exchange and renovations nearing completion**
- **Ambassador Bremer signed CPA Order 83, the Amendment to the Copyright Law**
 - **The Order modernizes existing Iraqi Copyright Law**
 - **Brings the current Iraqi Copyright Law into accordance with internationally-recognized standards of protection**

Goal 01 June 04: 6,000 MW Peak Deliverable Generation Capacity



- (U) CPA spring maintenance program continues resulting in about 1,298 MW of generation capacity currently offline for scheduled and 573 MW for unscheduled maintenance




Power Production

By Region




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Hours of Power – Week of 06 May



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AVERAGE HOURS OF ELECTRICITY AVAILABLE TO GOVERNORATE PER DAY OVER A 7 DAY PERIOD



Crude Oil Production




Weekly Average of 1.950 MBPD Is Below Target of 2.5 MBPD



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

Kerosene Supply

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


- This week's average production and imports are 80% of goal



Gasoline / Benzene Supply

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


- This week's average production and imports are 75% of goal

Security - Build Justice

- The number of detainees at Abu Ghraib prison will be reduced from the current 3,800 to no more than 2,000
- Legal advisors are working with detention facilities to refer Iraqi detainees to appropriate Iraqi courts
- The Iraqi Corrections Service (ICS) is preparing to assume responsibility for local detention centers from the Iraqi police
 - Will allow ICS to improve detention centers to international standards
 - Prison experts are working with the ICS to improve penal operations
- Twenty-eight Iraqi judges returned after attending a two-day rule-of-law conference in The Hague
 - First time in over 30 years they have met with international counterparts (included Supreme Court Justices O'Connor and Kennedy)
- The second of six judicial training courses has been completed, each course will train approximately 30 judges

Security - Developments

- **Coalition and Iraqi forces have assisted families returning to Fallujah**
 - **As the security situation has improved, families have been allowed to return at a rate of approximately 200 per day**
- **Iraqi officials, CPA, and Coalition Forces continue planning to disband militias and integrate members into Iraqi society and security forces**
- **For the Week of 01-07 May, the Iraqi Army returned nearly 350 soldiers to duty following the desertion and hostilities of the past month**
 - **474 personnel remain absent without leave**
 - **300 new recruits have commenced training**
- **Three new Iraqi Army battalions have been staffed by instructors and are receiving new recruits**
 - **One battalion was due to begin recruit training during week of 08-14 May**

CPA Objectives: Security

Achieve a Secure and Stable Environment; Develop Institutions that are Effective in Protecting Society and Constitutional Order ; Develop Iraqi Defense Capabilities and Oversight Mechanism

Security – Developments (Cont.)

- The Iraqi Civil Defense Corps (ICDC) expanded its authorized strength by 1,500 in response to hostilities in western and southern Iraq
- During week of 01-07 May, the number of Iraqi Police Service (IPS) officers increased by more than 1,500 :
 - 171 operatives from Najaf and Karbala returned to duty after completing reconstitution training

- Chart shows significant insurgent activities in Iraq, includes attacks using:

- Improvised explosive devices (IED), vehicle-borne IEDs, mortars, rocket propelled grenades (RPG), and improvised rockets
