

U.S. – Brazil Solid Waste Trade Opportunities: Introduction

- Population greater than 200 million and growing
 - Over a dozen cities with at least one million residents.
- 2015 MSW market revenue of \$8.5 billion
 - Goods and services needed include: waste collection vehicles, processing equipment, landfill and landfill gas equipment, and environmental and consulting services


Total MSW Generation (t/day)





Brazil's Solid Waste Problem

- Waste generation increased 12% in 5 years
- Only 10 of 26 states have solid waste management plans
- 30 million metric tons go to more than 2,900 dumpsites and uncontrolled landfills every year





Brazilian Trade Barriers

- Tariff escalation tied to local content requirements
- Tendering practices favor domestic businesses over foreign bidders
- Local certifications and safety approvals do not recognize international equivalents
- Failure to recognize international standards



Recommendation: Resurrect U.S.-Brazil Dialogue

- Resurrect bilateral discussions under the U.S. Brazil
 Commercial Dialogue
 - Address trade barriers relating to solid waste and other environmental services
- Incorporate the recommendations of the 2014-2016 ETTAC charter
 - Facilitate a series of workshops
 - Address environmental issues
 - Overcome trade barriers







- Quantifies the solid waste opportunities in Brazil; contains additional recommendations concerning capacity building and funding
- Recommend Toolkit be distributed to the inter-agency Environmental Trade Working Group
- Toolkit format can be used to identify other countries that have similar needs, offer opportunities for American businesses
